Who Can Be a K-Move Mentor?

Any foreign business professional who wants to make a positive difference in Korean society and help Korean young students to pursue their career overseas.

The Responsibilities of a Mentor Include:

- Being paired with less than 5 Korean young mentees motivated to work overseas
- Being available for mentees for activities below for at least 1 year:
 1. On-line consulting (e.g. SMS, Email, Messenger, [our web-site](#) etc.)
 2. Off-line meetings (flexible with time and place, e.g. café, mentor's office etc.),
 3. Lectures in universities (if possible) etc.

** Mentor will be supported by HRD Korea for the selection of mentees, seminar & consulting tour arrangements, a ₩500,000 honorarium (quarterly), additional costs for lectures in universities, etc.*
