M&A and anti-corruption due diligence including third party risks

Anti-corruption enforcement agencies continue to increase their emphasis on the obligation of companies to conduct pre-acquisition anti-corruption due diligence and post-acquisition compliance improvements in the M&A context. A failure to conduct appropriate due diligence can subject an acquiring company to liability for an investment's historical misconduct, decrease the value of the investment, and harm the acquiring company's reputation and future business prospects. Conversely, proper due diligence can decrease the likelihood of future violations by helping the acquirer to understand – and mitigate – potential corruption risks.

Conducting risk-based anti-corruption due diligence in the M&A context is never simple. The complexities of anti-corruption due diligence are compounded in cross-border transactions, which subject commercial parties to multiple legal regimes, cultures, and business standards. This panel will examine best practices in the context of cross-border anti-corruption due diligence, including with respect to the unique challenges imposed under frequently-encountered Korean, US, and Chinese laws and regulations.

The rise of whistleblowers and implications to corporations – managing your own employees

US Dodd Frank Act and other similar acts (eg, Public Interest Whistleblowers Act in South Korea) encouraging whistleblower activities have changed the compliance environment of corporations, as whistleblowers play a critical role in discovering misconduct. This session will explore what kind of legislative framework each jurisdiction has created in order to encourage whistleblowers to come forward, including protective measures and reward system. The session will also address how companies should handle whistleblowers and their reports, including what

kind of internal policy to implement, first steps to take on receiving a report, when to involve outside counsel, and ultimately, when/whether to report a potential misconduct to regulators. The panellists will include practitioners with extensive experience in the field who have dealt with these issues first-hand, and able therefore to share real-life experience.

Is it possible to draw a fine line between hospitality and bribery? – Gift and entertainment practices

What is the boundary between hospitality and bribery? What would be the most important factor in making the distinction? Do government agencies in different jurisdictions view hospitality and bribery differently. If so, how?

A compliance officer at a corporation conducting business in Asia faces such a question every day. Known as 'guanxi' in China, building and maintaining 'relationship' through hospitality appears to have no less importance in Asian culture in the 21st century than 100 years ago. Moreover, this seems to be the case not only in commercial context but also in relationships with government or quasi-government entities. South Korea's new law (so called 'Kim Young-Ran Act') makes audacious attempt to root out solicitation and graft by seeking to penalise gifts and entertainments over certain thresholds, regardless of whether they meet the traditional definition of bribe. This session seeks to explore and discuss whether such an attempt will be successful and how companies can operate within legal boundaries while maintaining business in Asia.

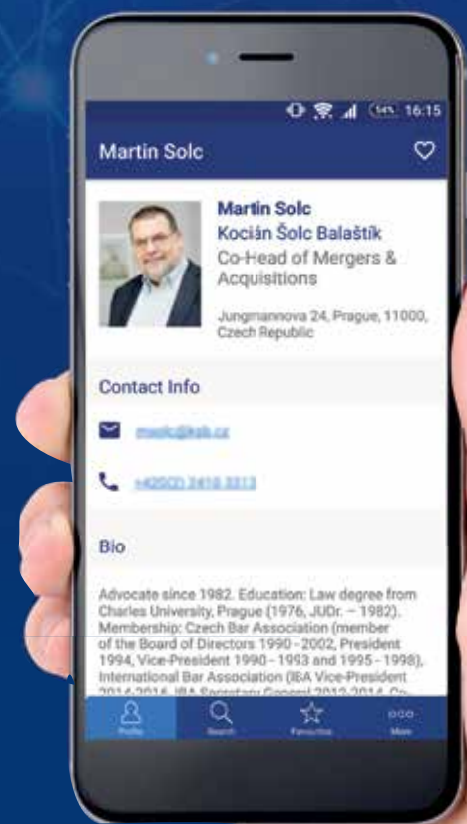
