## About the Survey



Impact of COVID-19 Outbreak on European Companies in Korea

ECCK is tracking changing sentiment and priorities for European companies in Korea, as businesses respond to unprecedented disruptions to daily operations brought on by the COVID-19 outbreak. The results shown here are the findings from the second round of the survey. This survey reflects the views of 44 European companies, representing over 25,000 employees and a total turnover of EUR 26 billion (KRW 35 trillion). The survey was conducted from March 24 until 31.

#### **Key Findings**

- 71% of European companies surveyed forecast decrease in revenues for the first half of 2020, and 61% are considering to lower the company's annual business performance target.
- 64% of respondents expect that their organization would be back to normal within three months if the coronavirus were to end immediately.
- 86% replied the government measures did not slow down or hinder business operations.





Total number of employees: 24,525



Total revenue: EUR 26 billion (KRW 35 trillion)







Is the novel coronavirus outbreak, and the resulting prevention-and-control measures, having any current impact on your business?





To what extent will the novel coronavirus outbreak and the resulting prevention-and-control measures impact your company's revenue in the first half of 2020?





#### Do you plan to adjust your company's 2020 business performance target?







Regarding the novel coronavirus outbreak, what kind of support measures would you like to see introduced by the Korean Government for your specific business?

#### Tax & Finance

- Financial support to companies to ensure liquidity (grants, loans, solidarity fund)
- Delay of tax payments, tax exemption and reduction
- Delay / reduction of social contribution payments
- Temporarily suspend, delay tax and other audits

#### Regulation & Work

- Delay / temporarily suspension of new regulations
- Elimination / temporarily suspension of policies restricting business recovery
- Flexibility in labour management: Lay-offs, 52-hour-work week
- Salary compensation or any support to maintain workforce, e.g. short-time working scheme [Kurzarbeit]
- Influence labour unions for being reasonable in salary increase demands, flexibilization of working time

Regarding the novel coronavirus outbreak, what kind of support measures would you like to see introduced by the Korean Government for your specific business?

#### **Procedures & Investment**

- Covid-19 is disrupting the global supply chain (manufacturing and logistics). This will have an impact on Korea supply. A few things can be done locally to offset the pressure. In Pharma, key actions from the authorities could be: reduce the duration of national inspection to accelerate products release, grace period on repacking to implement label changes in order to expedite products release, accelerate desktop review in lieu of GMP site inspections to expedite regulatory process. These actions will not completely prevent supply chain disruption at global level but will partially offset the impact in Korea.
- Invest more to stimulate macro economy
- Support measures to entertainment and other venues having dramatically suffered during the outbreak
- Free circulation of goods and employees in case of lockdown





#### How is your company operating amid the ongoing coronavirus outbreak? (Select all that apply)








