November 13, 2023, Seoul - The ECCK announced the winners of its second annual Sustainability Awards on the 10th of November during the ECCK Gala attended by distinguished guests especially the H.E. Georg Schmidt, the German ambassador to Korea and other diverse companies.

The award ceremony was held to acknowledge efforts made by European and Korean companies to create a better, more sustainable future, and to encourage and motivate other companies to do the same.

Following the evaluation of a total of 37 applications received this year, 3 grand prize winners were selected by an expert panel of 5 jury members. All applications were evaluated on the performance of their sustainability initiatives across 5 areas: vision, innovation, investment, collaboration, and impact. To qualify,



applicants also had to show how their initiatives were connected to Korea. From the 9 companies selected as top finalists, 6 companies received a certificate of recognition and 3 were appointed as grand prize winners.

The 'Green Steps' Award for SME and startup companies that demonstrate the best sustainable activities was given to the climate tech startup 'OysterAble' for paving the way for the implementation of accessible and enjoyable ways for citizens to recycle by offering brand discounts and other incentives via recycling units distributed in neighbourhoods across the country and a dedicated app.

The 'Blue Horizon' Award, given to companies that excel in carbon reduction, air purification, and clean energy activities, was awarded to the global offshore wind power development company Copenhagen Offshore Partners Korea (COP Korea). Copenhagen Offshore Partners is an exclusive partner for Copenhagen Infrastructure Partners (CIP), one of the largest global investors dedicated to greenfield renewable energy development. For this award, the organization's efforts to develop state-of-the-art offshore wind farms, knowledge sharing with domestic industry and academia, green job creation, and environmental protection were recognized.

Finally, the 'Golden Stars' Award, presented to companies that demonstrate the most outstanding ESG and multifaceted sustainability initiatives, was awarded to Mercedes-Benz Korea. Representative of one of Germany's automobile companies, Mercedes-Benz Korea has shown exceptional commitment to the promotion of education and local engagement on a wide range of sustainability matters in Korea through the development and implementation of various CSR activities, such as education programs on traffic safety and environmental awareness programmes.

During his opening remarks, ECCK Vice Chairperson Per Stenius mentioned that although the domestic and international environment is undergoing rapid changes, all companies today must consider sustainability for the future. He further stressed that unless we act now, we may miss opportunities to reverse the effects of climate change and that, without a doubt, government initiatives can only be realised through strong collaboration with and contributions from the private sector.

The ECCK has put sustainability as a key area of focus from 2021 onwards and is actively advocating for the development, promotion, and implementation of improved sustainability policies and practices locally. The 'ECCK Sustainability Awards' was first held in 2022 to this end and seeks to support, celebrate, and encourage European and Korean companies as they make moves towards a brighter, better, and more sustainable future for all.

Green Steps: Oysterable

- Green Steps Awarded to the SME/Start-up with the best sustainability initiatives.
- Blue Horizons Awarded to the company demonstrating the best Co2 Reduction, Clear Air, and/or Clean Energy initiatives.
- Golden Stars Awarded to the company with the best ESG/multifaceted sustainability initiatives.
